

Ameren Waste Management Policy

At Ameren, our mission is to power the quality of life. We fulfill our mission by providing safe, reliable and affordable energy to our customers in an environmentally responsible manner. In accordance with our Environmental Policy and our core value of stewardship, we responsibly manage the wastes that are produced through our operations. Our approach includes implementing measures to avoid waste generation, recycling and reusing materials, and properly disposing of wastes that cannot be recycled. Our policy is to:

Waste Avoidance and Reduction

- Reduce or eliminate waste where possible through resource recovery, recycling and reuse. Examples of reused or recycled items include, but are not limited to the following: scrap metal, transformers, oils, customer meters, wood, medium and high density plastic, cardboard, paper, shipping containers, office electronics, streetlights, batteries, and lightbulbs.
- Work with suppliers to optimize materials and packaging to reduce waste when purchasing materials and equipment.
- Reclaim scrap, surplus, substation and distribution transformers and electrical equipment, transmission material, energy center equipment, retired fleet and otherwise non-performing assets for recycling or resale.
- Pursue opportunities to enhance recycling efforts through beneficial use of coal combustion residuals (CCR) in compliance with EPA CCR regulations.
- Substitute hazardous chemicals and solvents where practical with alternatives that reduce hazardous waste generation.
- Manage remediation projects in a manner that minimizes waste generation.

Proper Waste Handling and Disposal

- Safely and properly dispose of hazardous and/or other wastes that cannot feasibly be reused or recycled.
- Manage excavated materials such as soil, rock, concrete and asphalt generated by our operations and ensure proper handling and disposal.

Compliance

- Comply with applicable waste laws and regulations.
- Conduct waste management compliance assessments at each Ameren facility, and provide applicable waste management training for facility personnel.
- Thoroughly evaluate waste vendors and conduct audits of waste disposal facilities.

Training and Continuous Improvement

- Educate employees and stakeholders on the Waste Management Policy.
- Review and update the Waste Management Policy as improvement opportunities are identified.
