Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation Honors Dr. J.P. (Jack) London, CACI Chairman, With Semper Fidelis Award

Recognition is for Sustained Commitment to U.S. Marines and Their Families

ARLINGTON, Va.--(BUSINESS WIRE)-- CACI International Inc ([NYSE:CACI](#)) announced today that Dr. J.P. (Jack) London, Executive Chairman and Chairman of the Board, has received the Semper Fidelis Award from the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, the nation's oldest and largest provider of need-based scholarships to military children. The award is presented annually to individuals whose service to our nation exemplifies the Marine Corps motto to remain "Always Faithful" and who demonstrate a sustained commitment to Marines and their families.

He is a 24-year U.S. Navy active duty and reserve officer who has served on the Boards of Directors of the U.S. Naval Institute, U.S. Navy Memorial Foundation, Naval Historical Foundation, Friends of the National WWII Memorial, and CAUSE (Comfort for America's Uniformed Services), the wounded warriors support organization. His numerous honors include the Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz Award from the Navy League of the United States, the John W. Dixon Award from the Association of the United States Army, the Nathan Hale Award from the Reserve Officers Association, and the Admiral of the Navy George Dewey Award from the Naval Order of the United States. Dr. London is also a 2010 inductee into the Washington Business Hall of Fame and a 2012 inductee into the Greater Washington Government Contractor Awards Hall of Fame.

Commenting on the Semper Fidelis Award, Dr. London said, "I am honored to receive this award from the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, an organization that makes a great contribution to our nation's Marines and their families. CACI, too, has a longstanding tradition of support for our nation's military, and it is a privilege to be able to represent the CACI team through this recognition." A veteran himself, Dr. London established and continues to champion CACI's culture of ethics and good character, which reflects the company's dedication to its customers and the country. Among its many veterans hiring honors, CACI was recently ranked third in the nation on the 2014 "Best for Vets" employers list by *Military Times* magazine.
