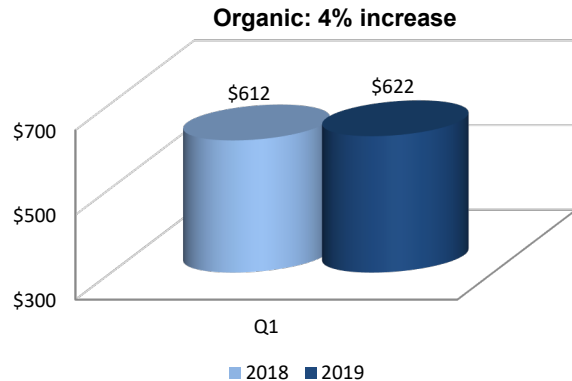

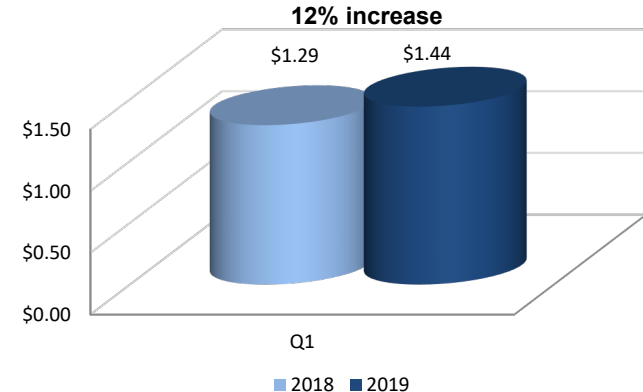
IDEX Q1 Financial Performance

(Dollars in millions, excl. EPS)

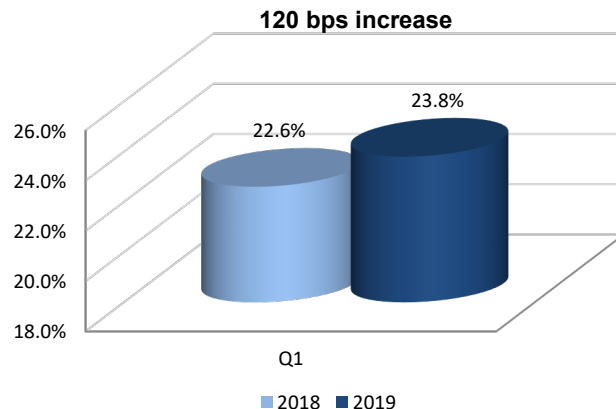
Sales



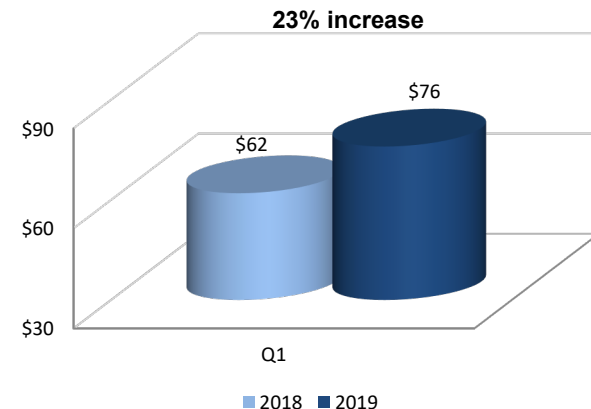
EPS*

Free Cash Flow



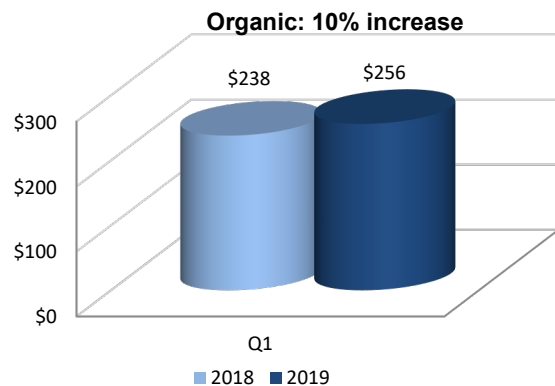

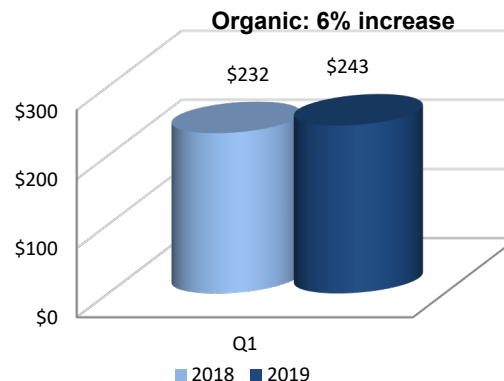

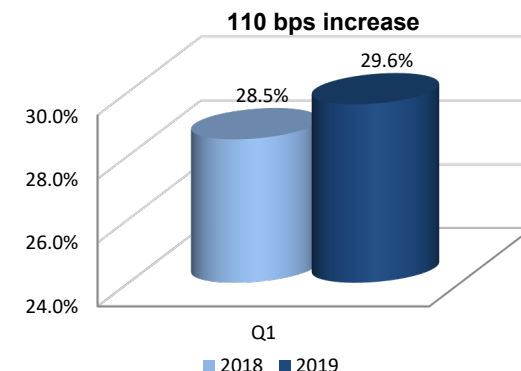

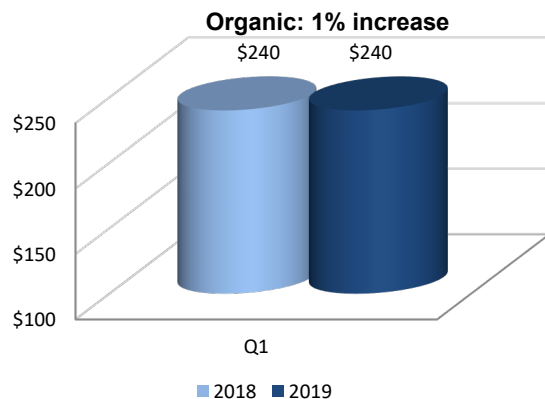
Q1 Highlights:

- ❑ Concerns on Ag market contraction materialized in Q1

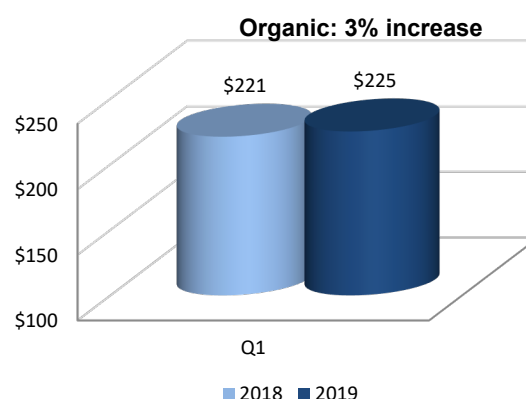

Organic orders up 10 percent with organic sales up 6 percent

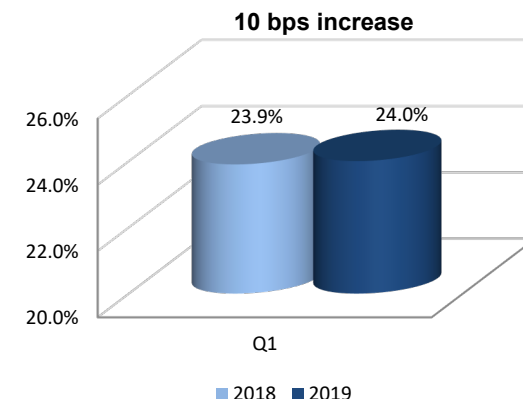

Q1 Highlights:

- AI and IVD/Bio remained steady and continued to grow through targeted NPD efforts
- Strong OEM demand and solid execution of growth initiatives in GAST
- Sealing business experienced downturn due to slowdown of semicon and lower auto sales
- Life Science orders and MPT sales were impacted by timing and one time events

- Operating margin data adjusted for restructuring expenses (\$1.1M in Q1 2018).

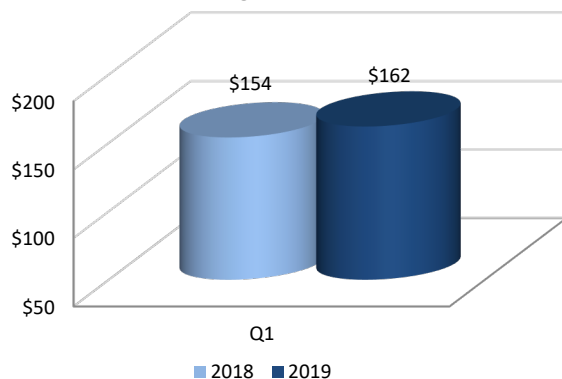
Organic sales growth of 3 percent

(Dollars in millions)

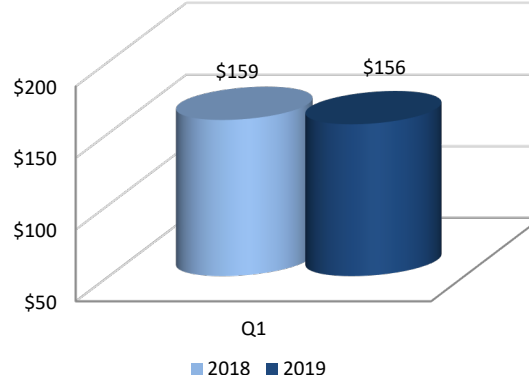

Organic: 9% increase



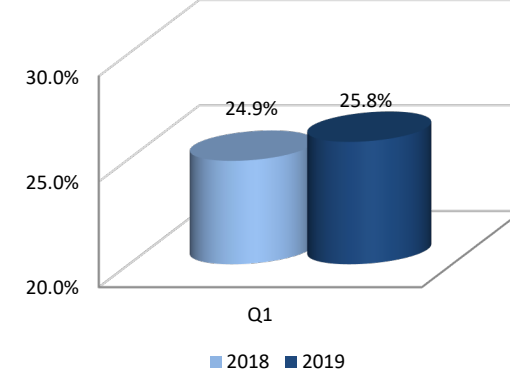
Sales

2019 Guidance Summary

Q2 2019

- EPS estimate range: \$1.47 – \$1.50
- Organic revenue growth: 4 – 5%
- Operating margin: ~24.0%
- Tax rate: ~22.5%
- FX impact: ~2.0% topline headwind based on March 31, 2019 FX rates
- Corporate costs: ~\$20 million

FY 2019

- EPS estimate range: \$5.70 – \$5.85
- Organic revenue growth: 4 – 5%
- Operating margin: ~24.0%
- FX impact: ~1.0% topline headwind based on March 31, 2019 FX rates
- Other modeling items:
 - Tax rate: ~22%
 - Cap Ex: > \$60M
 - Free cash flow will be approximately 105 to 110% of net income
 - Corporate costs: \$80 – \$82 million
 - EPS estimate excludes all future acquisitions and associated costs and any future restructuring expenses
